GUIDE TO AUTHORS

NDA JPSPS welcomes original and well-researched articles in political science, public policy, international relations, conflict and peace studies, security and strategic studies, governance and administration, political economy, gender studies, food security and other related disciplines with the view of enriching the body of knowledge. The manuscript should be concise as the topic, problem articulation, methods, results/findings and conclusion. Generally, the manuscript should not exceed 7000 words, including references (Research Articles). The authors are advised to strictly adhere to the format and style of the journal by carefully reading the notes for contributors before submitting their manuscripts.

SUBMISSION POLICY

Manuscripts found to be sufficient in quality and also meet the aims and scope of NDA JPSPS shall be reviewed and considered for publication. All manuscripts submitted to the Editor for consideration must not be under consideration or published by another journal or publisher. As part of the submission process, you will be required to certify that you are submitting your original work and that you have the rights to the work.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Conflict of interest is anything that interferes, or that could interfere with a thorough and objective assessment of a manuscript. This could include familiarity with the work and/or the likely author, previous collaboration with the author, and benefiting from the work submitted to you for review either directly or indirectly. Do not accept a review assignment if you have competing interests or conflicting. If you're unsure whether your relationship qualifies as a competing interest, contact the journal team for advice. During the review process, reviewers are guided by the review form provided to them by the editor. Fundamentally, reviewers provide a scientific assessment of the paper and consider its suitability for publication. The focus is also on the adequacy of content: presentation, novelty, and accessibility of the content. Their comments and suggestions generally provide direction for the improvement of the manuscript. The reviewers provide the following recommendations for decisions to be taken on the manuscript: Accept without revision(s), Accept with minor revision(s), Accept with major revision(s), and Reject with the option to Resubmit or

Reject. If reviewers recommend that revisions are required, they must furnish the author/s with specific guidance regarding those revisions. Also, they must indicate their willingness to review the paper after revision. If there is a tie for a manuscript, the editor will solicit one review as a tie-breaker. The editor will make the final decision on the acceptance and rejection of the paper. Reviewers are expected to submit reports within two weeks of acceptance to review.

PLAGIARISM POLICY

NDA JPSPS is committed to maintaining high standards through a critical peer-review process with grounded ethical policies. Any infringements of professional ethical codes, such as plagiarism, including self-plagiarism and fraudulent use of data, are seriously frowned upon by the journal with zero tolerance.

LANGUAGE

All papers should be written in English, and spelling should generally follow the Concise Oxford Dictionary of Current English. Abstracts in other languages will be printed if the author so desires.
